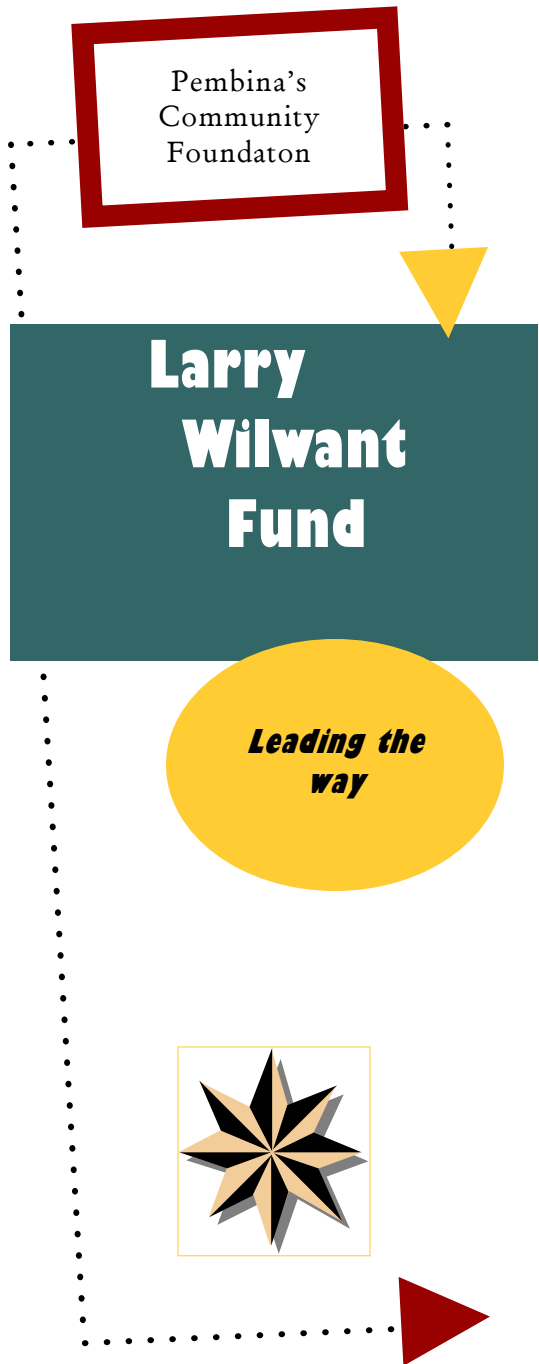
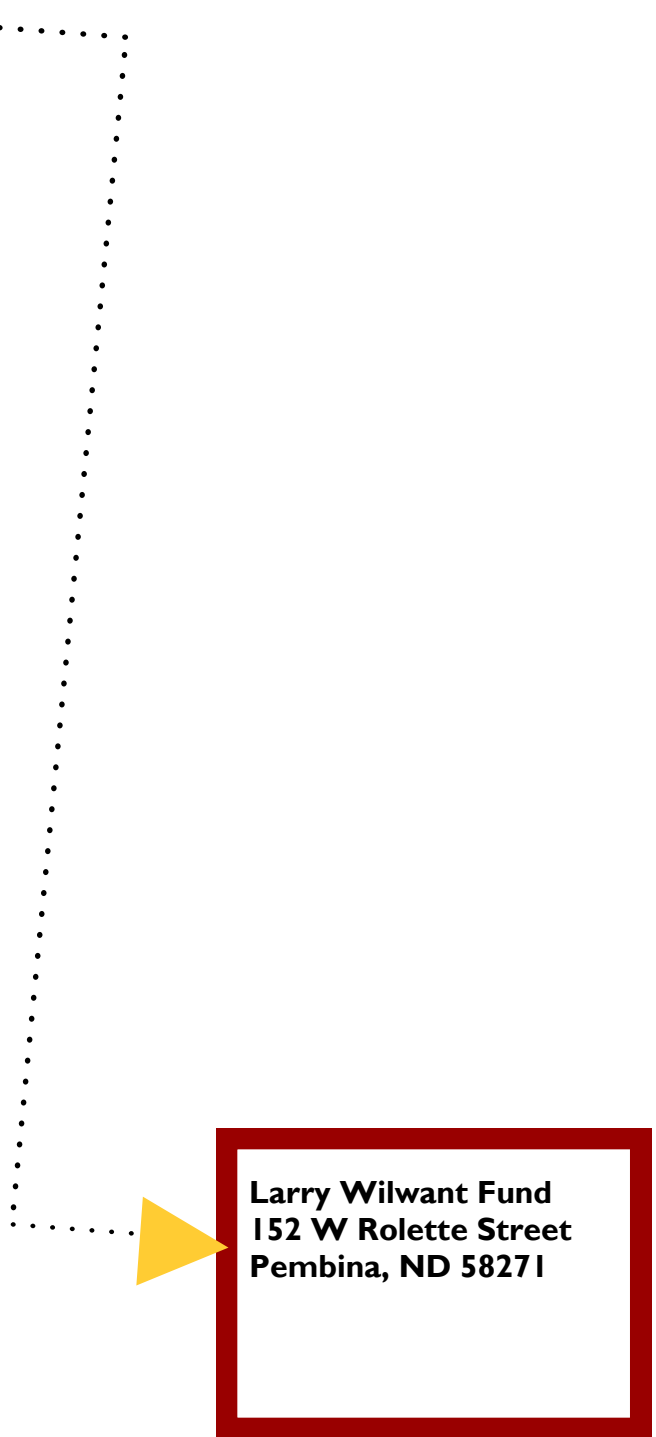
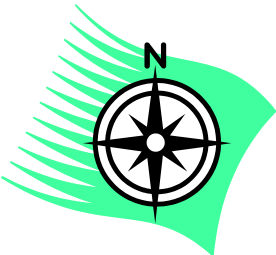

Larry J. Wilwant was born December 17, 1938 at Hallock, Minnesota to Ray and Olga, (Hartig) Wilwant. Ray and Olga lived in Pembina, North Dakota.

Larry grew up in Pembina, attending local schools until he graduated from high school with the class of 1956. He went on to earn a degree in Philosophy from the University of North Dakota.

Following graduation, Larry spent a year teaching in Los Angeles, California, where he also spent many hours visiting various Jazz clubs and functions, seeking out new musicians. This love of Jazz became an important focus, which continued through his life. He loved Jazz and travel. On returning to Pembina from his California experience, he farmed with his father until retirement.

Larry became an active member of the Winnipeg Jazz Society (their token American), where he made many friends and met Margaret, later to become his wife. During the 1984 Folkorama in Winnipeg, he served

as the Mayor of the United States Pavilion.

Larry was a strong supporter of the Pembina community. He actively served many years on the International Commission for Land and Water Stewardship and the Pembina River Basin Board. Larry knew the situations like no other and was concerned for the city of Pembina and its flooding problems. He was also co-chair of the Steering Committee for the Pembina Community Center renovation.

Larry passed away on September 29, 2007 at Cavalier County Memorial Hospital, Langdon, ND. He is survived by his brother Ray and his wife, Margaret.

Larry continued his support of the community of Pembina through a gift from his estate which established the Larry Wilwant Fund as a component fund of the North Dakota Community Foundation. The Fund will make grants for community projects in the Pembina, North Dakota area.

Grant Guidelines

*Grants will be made only to those organizations designated as a government entity or a non-profit, tax exempt group under IRS code 501(c)(3). Grants will not be made to individuals.

*Grants shall be awarded to organizations that serve the City of Pembina as determined by an Advisory Board of local residents.

*Grants to religious organizations will be limited to those activities which are non-denominational and serve the entire community.

*Grants will generally not exceed \$5000 per application.

*Low priority will be given to grants requesting funds for day-to-day operations.

*Applications must be **received** by March 15th of each year.
