NDCF ELECTS NEW DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

Bismarck, ND—The North Dakota Community Foundation (NDCF) is pleased to announce the election of David Meyer of West Fargo, Carla Peltier of Belcourt, and Terri Lang of Strasburg to three-year terms on the NDCF Board.

Meyer is the CEO of Titan Machinery, Inc. He has served on the boards of several organizations including the ND Implement Dealers Association Board, the Lisbon School Board, the Lisbon CHS Hospital Board, and has served as a Trustee on the University of Minnesota Foundation Board.

Peltier is a retired teacher. She has been a board member of Turtle Mountain Community College, an advisory board member of the Turtle Mountain Elementary School and Middle School, and a member of the ND Department of Health's Children's Special Health Services advisory board.

The North Dakota Community Foundation Board of Directors is made up of 15 volunteers from across the state. They receive no financial compensation for their service on the Board. They are elected from the population of North Dakota and are selected to represent a broad cross-section of North Dakotans. They can serve two three-year terms and then must leave the Board.

The North Dakota Community Foundation is a public, non-profit tax-exempt corporation which receives and distributes charitable funds to support a wide range of programs that improve the quality of life for North Dakotans. NDCF currently manages over 700 funds for various North Dakota communities and donors, including 67 community foundations and over 150 scholarship funds. It holds assets in excess of \$100 million and to date has made more than \$76 million in grants all across North Dakota, including over \$600,000 in recent COVID-19 response grants.
