\$8,933 Awarded in 2020

The MCEF was created to be a resource to support local community initiatives which provide a higher quality of life in the Maddock area. This year, the MCEF Advisory Committee awarded a total of \$8,933 in 3 different grants to the following organizations and projects:

- Maddock Public School: \$5,000 for the Technology Improvement Program to provide equipment for distance learning in all classrooms.
- Maddock Community Historical Society: \$1,966 for roof maintenance on several museum complex buildings



 Maddock Opera House Association: \$1,966 to assist with the USDA Loan Payment used to finish the second floor of the Harriman building. Due to COVID-19, income from rentals, events, and gaming have been greatly reduced making loan payments difficult.
