\$3,000 Awarded in 2025

The Emerado Community Endowment Fund Advisory Committee recently awarded its 2025 grants to the following organizations:

- **Emerado Museum:** \$2,240 to support the cost of utilities
- **ND Newspaper Association Education Foundation:** \$760 for Kid Scoop News ND

The grant dollars came from the Emerado Community Endowment Fund as well as from the Ascension Lutheran Church Charitable Fund, which supports projects and programs in Emerado and the surrounding area.

Donating Ag Commodities Makes Good Sense (& Cents)

Many North Dakotans do their charitable giving in a very tax-wise way - they gift a portion of their harvest.

"Gifting agricultural commodities is a really smart way to give back," noted Amy Stromsodt of the North Dakota Community Foundation, who works with area producers on their gifts. "Farmers can deduct the cost of production, but the portion of the harvest that is donated does not have to be claimed as income to the self-employed farmer. This can result in thousands of dollars in tax savings as opposed to a straight gift of cash."

The Emerado Community Endowment Fund can accept many different types of agricultural commodities as gifts, including livestock.
