NDCF AWARDS \$153,493 IN GRANTS

Bismarck, North Dakota . . . The North Dakota Community Foundation (NDCF) has awarded \$153,493 in grants from its Statewide Greatest Needs (Unrestricted) Fund to 34 organizations across the state working to improve the quality of life for state residents.

The grant checks will be delivered over the next several weeks by NDCF Development Directors Amy Stromsodt of Larimore, Kara Geiger of Bismarck, and John Heinen of Dickinson.
