# \$11,150 Awarded in 2024

The Finley Community Endowment Fund awarded two grants in October of 2024 to the following organizations and projects:

- Finley Wildlife Club: \$8,150 for their Bi-Annual Auction
- **City of Finley Finley Days:** \$3,000 for advertising for the 2025 Finley Days Celebration

Grants are awarded once a year. Any nonprofit organization or government entity providing services to the Finley area can apply. More information and the online application are available at www.NDCF/Finley. Applications are due in early October.



The 2024 Finley Days Celebration included a sand volleyball tournament and minnow races. A 2023 grant from the Finley Community Endowment Fund helped the committee send out bulk mailers to everyone in the community and surrounding area.

"The best part about Finley Days is that everything is free to the public," wrote Holly Stromsodt in their grant application. "We do not charge for ANY of the events on Saturday or Sunday, including the street dance."


## **Fund Growth Over the Years**

The Finley Community Endowment Fund ended 2024 with a market value of over \$360,000! This is a permanent fund so that money will provide grant dollars for our area forever.

How did we get to this amount? First, a group of local residents had the forethought to create this fund at the North Dakota Community Foundation back in 2002. Then, many individuals and businesses have donated to this fund over the years, either through fundraisers or by sending in a check. In fact, more than 125 different families or businesses have given to this fund!

We received significant contributions from the North Dakota Community Foundation's matching grant program (\$45,285), the Griggs Steele Empowerment Zone (\$40,000), Citizens State Bank (\$27,321), and the Finley Improvement Association (\$24,170). Several individuals and families have also made thousands of dollars in donations to our fund over the years.

The chart below shows the **market value of our fund as of December 31 every year** since it started. What tremendous growth!

"Gifting agricultural commodities is a really smart way to give back," noted Amy Stromsodt of the North Dakota Community



Foundation, who works with area producers on their gifts. *"Farmers can deduct the cost of production, but the portion of the harvest that is donated does not have to be claimed as income to the self-employed farmer. This can result in thousands of dollars in tax savings as opposed to a straight gift of cash."* 

The Finley Community Endowment Fund can accept many different types of agricultural commodities as gifts, including livestock.
