\$10,585 Awarded in 2022

The AACF was created to be a resource to support local community initiatives which provide a higher quality of life in the Anamoose area. This year, the AACF Advisory Committee awarded a total of \$10,585 in five different grants in September to the following organizations and projects:

- City of Anamoose for a mural on the old post office exterior wall: \$3,000
- Tri-County Senior Meals & Services -Support for the senior nutrition program in Anamoose: \$3,000
- City of Anamoose for artwork on windows of the old Hoffert building and grocery store: \$2,000
- City of Anamoose Park Board to update the bathrooms in the park: \$1,985.21
- City of Anamoose for Main Street Flowers in 2023: \$600


Grants are awarded once a year. Any organization with a 501(c)(3) status or government agency may apply. Applications are available online at www.NDCF.net/Anamoose.

Give Other Than or In Addition to Cash?

Why, yes you can! The Anamoose Area Community Foundation can accept many different types of gifts. Depending on your situation, you may want to consider donating one of the following for their tax benefits or other reasons:

- Real estate, which allows the donor to deduct the current appraised value of the real estate and avoid capital gains taxes.
- Fully depreciated business property (farm equipment, etc.) You can't take a tax deduction, but there is no tax due on the transfer and the value of the property qualifies for the ND 40% income tax credit if given to a qualified ND endowment fund, such as the Anamoose Area Community Foundation.
- Gifts of farm commodities, which don't give a tax deduction, however they don't have to be counted as income. You can still deduct the cost of production for whatever you donate. These gifts also may qualify for the 40% ND income tax credit for gifts to qualified ND endowment funds. (Note: you must donate the commodity first to get these tax advantages, not sell it and donate the proceeds later.)
- Appreciated investment assets, valued on the date of transfer, are tax deductible and you can avoid paying capital gains tax.
 These gifts may also qualify for the ND income tax credit.
- Charitable IRA rollover counts as your required minimum distribution, but you don't need to claim the donated portion as federal income and the gift may qualify for the 40% ND income tax credit.
- Gifts of mineral acres outright, assignment of mineral royalty income, or make the Anamoose Area Community Foundation an income or remainder beneficiary of your family mineral trust.
