Background: The Hazelton-Moffit-Braddock Community Foundation was established in 2019 by the Ranschler and Dahl families, who have been a part of the HMB community since the early 1900's. Their gifts, made in honor of their relative Theodore Ranschler (Uncle T) helped establish this permanent endowment fund, which will provide grant dollars every year to support area nonprofits that work in the education, community improvement, and quality of life areas. A committee made up of local residents leads fundraising efforts to continue to grow the fund and reviews grant applications and recommends grant awards every year. The HMB Community Foundation (now the Hazelton Area Community Foundation) is a component fund of the North Dakota Community Foundation.
