Our Mission

Established in 2015, the **Adams County Community Foundation** is a community-focused, permanent endowment fund from which any service entity in Adams County can request special project funding. Earnings from the fund can be given as grants to support nonprofit projects or programs in the area that work to improve our community and quality of life. Our fund gives residents and alumni of the area a way to leave a legacy that will improve the quality of life for themselves, their families, and their community for years to come.

Our Committee

Our committee of local volunteers tell the authentic story of the Foundation and our community. The committee supports those who hope to leave a legacy in the community, connecting them to important information about their gifts and to the Foundation. The committee also reviews grant applications and recommends funding awards based on impact in the community. Finally, the committee advocates for growth of the Foundation, understanding that the bigger the fund, the more grants we can award to local service entities, and the better we can help tell Adams County's authentic story.

Our Service

The interest earnings from our community foundation can be given as grants to worthwhile projects and programs in the area. Initial grants from our fund went to Adams County Social Services for their Drug & Alcohol Program and the Hettinger Golf Association for their Youth Golf Program.

Future grants could go for:

- Playground improvements
- New equipment for the local Fire Department
- Accessibility for community facilities
- Books & supplies for the local library or school
- New equipment for the local clinic
- Repairs to the local Senior Citizens Center

Who Can Get Grants
