# **2023 Annual Update**

A Status Update for Donors and Supporters of Rolla's Permanent Endowment Fund.

### **\$19,480 Awarded in 2023**

The Rolla Community Endowment Fund Advisory Committee awarded a total of \$19,480 in eight different grants to the following organizations in 2023:

- Mt. Pleasant Public School District #4 (Rolla High School): \$5,000 for football field lights
- Rolette County Public Health: \$3,000 for a security and alarm system in their clinic and garage
- Rolla American Legion Baseball: \$2,500
- Rolla Volunteer Fire Department: \$2,000 for SCBA (self-contained breathing apparatus) cylinder replacement
- City of Rolla Forestry: \$2,000 for flowers on Main
- Rolla Chamber of Commerce: \$1,841 for Rolla's 135th Ragtop Festival
- Rolla Public Library: \$1,639 for Full STEAM ahead for summer reading
- Rolette County Historical Society: \$1,500 to light up the wheat sculpture to recognize the 10th anniversary

Grants are awarded from the fund once a year. Any organization with a 501(c)(3) status or government agency may apply. Applications are available online at www.NDCF.net/Rolla.



#### **Fund Growth Over the Years**

The Rolla Community Endowment Fund has a market value of over \$500,000! This is a permanent fund so that money will provide grant dollars for our area forever.

How did we get to this amount? First, a group of local residents had the forethought to create this fund at the North Dakota Community Foundation back in 2002. Then, many people and businesses have donated to this fund over the years, either through fundraisers or by sending in a check. Our largest donors have been Frank Larson (who provided a \$100,000 matching gift two years ago), Starion Bank, First State Insurance Agency of Rolla, and Turtle Mountain And the North Dakota Communications. Community Foundation (our partner) provided over \$48,000 since our inception!

The chart below shows the **fund balance as of Dec. 31 of every year** (the 2023 balance is as of September 30). You can see the impact of Frank's matching gift (and all of our donations to meet that match) in 2021 - our fund balance skyrocketed! Our funds are invested and the markets saw a dip in 2022, but we are expecting the balance to rebound in the next year.



The larger this fund grows, the more and larger grants we can award. We are hoping to eventually become a \$1 million community fund (yes, in Rolla!)
