Community Foundation Grant Improves Play Area for Kids

When students at Lincoln Elementary School in Beach wanted to play football or other games, they had to play in the street, on the gravel playground, or on cement tennis courts nearby. These hard surfaces resulted in numerous injuries throughout the year. Wouldn't it be nice if the students had a grassy field to play on?

That is what the Beach school board thought as they looked at the vacant land across from Lincoln Elementary. The field was in poor condition with many holes and chunks of concrete and large rocks. Surely there could be a better way to make it available to the kids and improve the community?

So the school cleaned up the property, leveled the ground, and planted grass seed. Although the grass got a good start in the spring, the drought took its toll and it quickly died.

To make the space usable, the grass needed

So when the local community foundation asked for grant applications for local projects, the school submitted a grant and was awarded \$2556 to cover half the costs to dig a well.

"The well will allow us to maintain the grass no matter the weather conditions, and the kids will have a beautiful spot to play" said Randy Dietz, custodian at Liberty Elementary and the project coordinator. "We were not sure where we were going to get the funds so we are very grateful that the Golden Valley County Community Foundation exists and that the local committee awarded us this grant."

If you would like to help grow the Golden Valley County Community Foundation, there are many easy ways to support our fund:


Write a check every year on your birthday. Together, these gifts from area residents would grow our fund into a huge resource for our school, park district, and other nonprofit organizations!
