NDCF AWARDS \$172,646 IN GRANTS

Bismarck, North Dakota . . . The North Dakota Community Foundation has awarded \$172,646 in grants from its Statewide Greatest Needs (Unrestricted) Fund to 39 organizations across the state working to improve the quality of life for state residents.
