NDCF AWARDS \$212,200 IN GRANTS

Bismarck, North Dakota . . . The North Dakota Community Foundation has awarded \$212,200 in grants from its Statewide Greatest Needs (Unrestricted) Fund to 50 organizations across the state working to improve the quality of life for state residents.

"We saw a tremendous increase in the number of requests from food pantries this year," said Kevin J. Dvorak, President & CEO of NDCF. "We are glad to be able to partner with these organizations that are supplying basic necessities to those most in need in their area."

Part of the funding for these grants came from the PPREP Community Foundation Disaster Response Fund, a project of The Funders Network. The Funders Network provided \$20,000 to the North Dakota Community Foundation to address impacts associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.
